Behavioural Insights

Behavioural and social science provide invaluable insight on the challenges of overcoming protracted socioeconomic hardship. Already, ‘Nudge’ architecture is widely employed in both the private and public sector to gently nudge the way everyday decisions are considered—without eroding freedom of choice.

Making healthy choices is just one feature of the multifaceted CSN approach to nurturing long-term social transformation. Responding to the trauma of scarcity—the psychological impact of poverty, and the catalysts that can themselves become barriers to change—are equally vital to enabling communities to successfully navigate and sustain socioeconomic recovery.

Digital Technology & Innovation

CSN maximises the advantages of digital innovation to enhance local cohesion. Its support networks will enable individuals to effortlessly identify and connect with like-minded others, creating a safe and secure space for civil and social engagement.

CSN digital solutions create the means to enhance the application of behavioural insights, facilitating widespread communal social support that can counteract isolation and exclusion.

CSN will provide real-time, representational and accurate **Big Data Analytics** and reporting, based on real-lived experiences—enabling communities to better predict and plan for future needs.

Community Collectives, with CSN and Partner support, are assisted in developing a response to both the **practical** and **psychological** impact of socioeconomic barriers and challenges.

Through contracted and voluntary **Partnerships** with local providers, CSN can coordinate professional, specialist and technical expertise into holistic **Communal Social Support** offerings.

CSN combines a digital platform (community network) with professional support, and extensive engagement, to facilitate community-led social transformation.

CSN Communal Solutions encourage whole communities to pull together to respond to common needs, concerns and aspirations that have the potential to provide widespread local benefits.

Supported by their local CSN, **Community Collectives** are enabled to pool their efforts and resources to identify and implement joint solutions to what are often shared objectives.

CSN tailored **in-house services** ensure each community collective has access to the right tools, skills, resources and support that are essential for success.

Behavioural insights & social transformation

Extraordinary scientific breakthroughs have established that as wonderfully unique and varied as we all are, we are also incredibly similar—no more so than in our cognitive and psychological functions.

Behavioural and Social Science have the potential to explain almost all human behaviour and, more importantly, to scientifically equip us to overcome barriers to life enriching growth and change.

Across multiple areas of research and scientific disciplines three key responses emerge as vital to facilitating sustainable socioeconomic transformation:

1.
Negate the material impact of scarcity

Science of scarcity research from Prof. Sendhil Mullainathan, evidences that without appropriate intervention unhealthy decisions (predictably irrational mistakes) are almost certainly guaranteed.

2.
Respond to psychological and cognitive barriers

Community Support Network [CSN] will make it possible for entire communities to work together to create the right conditions to sustain socioeconomic recovery and long-term transformation.

3.
Counteract detrimental external factors and conditions

Realising new hope, potential and possibilities

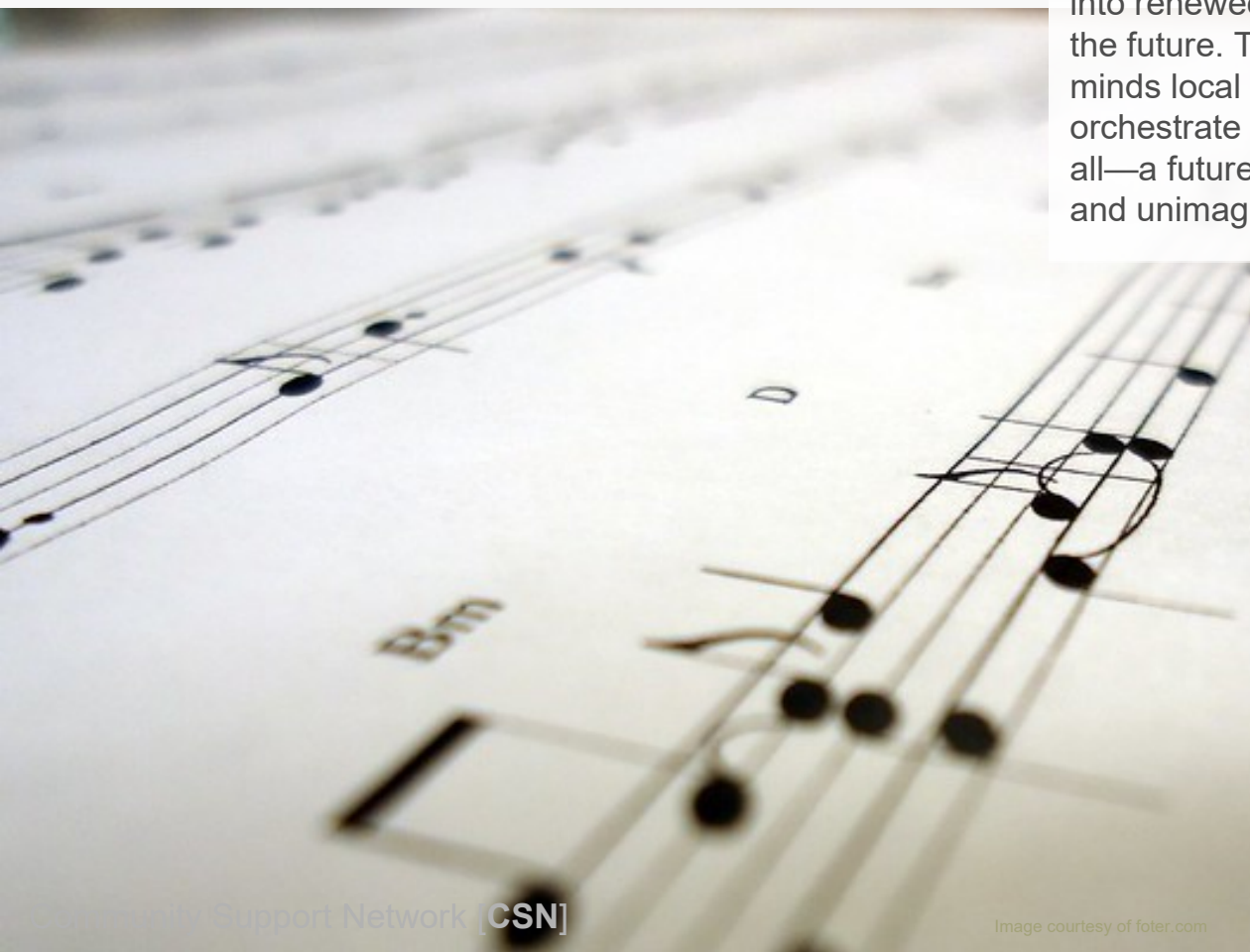
There is more that binds than divides

With CSN support, Community Reclaim and other rights can be maximised to reinvigorate unused or underutilised spaces and resources, turning them into socially thriving and commercially viable, community-run enterprises: Edible gardens, cafés, artisanal outlets—cultural initiatives to inspire, create employment, future project funding and ensure financial sustainability.

Professional Engagement

Professional insight and experience is vital to developing holistic, sustainable communal social support solutions.

Community Engagement

Fundraising & Donation


CSN will be, community-led, independent and run for the benefit of the whole community. Financial sustainability is achieved through nominal membership fees, fundraising, donations and commercial social enterprises, enabling everyone to participate.

Community Projects

Community initiatives and enterprises will focus on addressing local challenges, improving social integration, providing mental health support, and or ensuring the financial viability of the local CSN. Whatever the primary objective, community cohesion will sit at the heart of every CSN project.

Partnerships

CSN is designed to succeed in collaboration with the local community—resident, professional and corporate. Opportunities exist for formal partnerships, volunteering, i.e. through Corporate Social Responsibility [CSR] programmes and or in an oversight capacity, such as auditing or on the CSN Board of Trustees.
